Historical Ecology & Coastal Archeology (BMSC)

Jul 22 - Aug 9

This course will introduce students to historical ecology from an archaeological perspective. We will visit a series of coastal archaeological sites in Nuu-chah-nulth territory in Barkley Sound and examine archaeological and ecological data from these sites in the lab. The majority of our time will be spent in the labs at the Bamfield Marine Sciences Centre campus and in the Treaty lands and traditional territory of the Huu-ay-aht First Nations.

Prerequisite: For undergraduate credit, an introductory course in Archaeology or permission of the Instructor. For graduate credit, acceptance in an MA, MSc or PhD program in biology, environmental studies or anthropology (or by permission from the instructor via application).
